#### THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - Hymn StF No. 277 (part)

- My song is love unknown, my Saviour's love to me, .....
  O who am I, that for my sake my Lord should take frail flesh and die ?
- 3. Sometimes they strew his way, and his sweet praises sing, "Hosannas" to their king. Then "Crucify"...and for his death they thirst and cry.
- 5. They rise and needs will have my dear Lord made away; A murderer they save, the Prince of Life they slay
- 6. In life, no house, no home, my Lord on earth might have; in death no friendly tomb, But what a stranger gave. What may I say....mine was the tomb wherein he lay.
- 7. Here might I stay and sing, no story so divine:

#### Never was love, dear King, never was grief like thine ! This is my Friend in whose sweet praise I all my days could gladly spend.

**<u>REFLECTION</u>** – The cross is not mentioned in this hymn by Samuel Crossman, but it is at the heart of all his sentiments.

The cross is the central symbol of our faith as Christians, and we recognise an empty (unadorned) cross, to symbolise a <u>risen</u> Christ, as opposed to having a crucifix, depicting Christ <u>on</u> his cross.

The Jews were not authorised to carry out the death sentence, hence their handing over Jesus to be crucified, by the Roman authorities. Crucifixion was a tremendously cruel, horrific and drawn out way of dying, usually reserved for criminals.

Jesus knew he had to undergo this and told his disciples that God willed that he should die, and the account of his agony of doubt and dedication to God's will in Gethsemane proved his obedience to God.

Jesus' death is about sacrifice for sin, and his forerunner John recognised him as the chosen "Lamb of God" who takes away the sins of the world.

The hymn known as "My song is love unknown", is an attempt by Crossman to explain what Jesus' death means to an individual trying to comprehend it. Jesus himself summed up the purpose and meaning when speaking to Nicodemus, in John 3: 16 – "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not die, but have everlasting life"

Crossman sees himself as the recipient of Jesus' love, as he recalls the fickle crowd who first are shouting "Hosannas", then, stirred up by Jesus' enemies, they instead shout "Crucify him!"

The author says of Jesus that in contrast to Barabbas, who was a murderer, Jesus is the Prince of Life; he goes on to say that in Joseph of Arimathea's offer of a tomb, that Jesus was undeserving of dying, let alone having a tomb – yet he says, the tomb was where he was deserving to be – "<u>Mine</u> the tomb wherein he lay". In the final verse he acknowledges that this is a story we should stay and contemplate, and "sing" about, and give praise to one whom we have come to acknowledge as dear "Friend" and "King" in our relationship with God whose love reached its climax on the cross of Calvary. Every blessing, *John.*
