#### THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - COLOSSIANS 3 Verses 12-14 (part)

### Therefore, as God's chosen people,..... clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another: forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love...... <u>REFLECTION:</u>

This portion comes from Paul's letter to the church at Colossae (the Colossians) and is headed "Rules for Holy Living" in the NIV bible. It is from the reading for Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> April, in the Methodist Prayer handbook. When we have responded to God's call to be disciples of Christ, we are often exhorted by Paul in his letters to "put off" or shun, or give up old habits and behaviour and instead to "put on" or clothe ourselves in, a new kind of behaviour. It is the evidence of our being transformed by the ministry of the Holy Spirit; as believers we become new people. It follows therefore that our conduct should match our calling and our profession of faith in Jesus Christ, whose life was the example for us all.

Here we are reminded of the need for compassion and kindness, along with humility, gentleness, patience, forbearance, the ability to find forgiveness, for grievances, whether real or imagined (we are at times too quick to take offence !); and to find love, or at least a liking for all with whom we come into contact.

How often do we bear a grudge against someone for a trivial slight, about which we may not even remember the origins and experience estrangement for years – unnecessarily !

Love enables us to look for reconciliation and peace between not only one another, but between communities, nations and cultures. As Paul says, "above all let peace rule in your hearts(v15). After all as people of faith, we follow the Prince of Peace. As we read above "Forgive" because "the Lord forgave you". And forgiveness is the basis of peace and reconciliation. The Northern Ireland Peace Accord could not have happened without an element of forgiveness between the parties. We also pray and hope for an eventual such an agreement for peace between Ukraine and Russia and in other places where conflict exists. Every blessing, *John.*
