THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - From Singing the Faith No. 351, verse 1

"In Christ alone my hope is found, he is my light, my strength, my song:.... my comforter, my all in all, here in the love of Christ I stand."

REFLECTION:

One of the many hymn songs composed by the prolific team of Keith Getty and Stuart Townend, this is found in the section of the hymnbook headed "Jesus Christ the Saviour: Lord of all", between the resurrection songs and those celebrating the gift of the Holy Spirit.

As we deal with all that life can throw at us, the one constant is our trust in Christ, who offers us an example, comfort, strength, and light in the darkest times.

When a boy I had an illuminated text on my bedroom wall - Philippians 4: 13 - "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me". My father used to point me to that when I complained about my school tasks, or anything else that was troubling me.

Going through life's journey, I have always found that I don't have to travel alone.

God is always there and the remembrance of what Jesus experienced helps me to cope.

Whatever we have to bear, whether it is loneliness, rejection, hardship, persecution, betrayal and so on, Jesus understands because in his human life he endured the same, and more even unto death!

One of the aspects of worship I enjoy most is singing, and that was the most difficult thing during Covid, when we were told not to sing. I enjoy secular songs, but most of all I enjoy singing praise to God, because we have such a wonderful legacy of hymns, which enable us to express, praise, thanks, petition, confession and so on.

It is surely because we "stand in the love of Christ" ("stand" in this sense, I feel, meaning to be steadfast and firm, unmoved in our trust in God's care for us) that we can say with the hymnwriter, that Christ is our "hope, light" and our "all in all". Every blessing John.
