## THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – TRINITY SUNDAY:

The final words of Jesus recorded in Matthew's gospel – "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the son and of the Holy Spirit".

As the hymn says "God in three persons, blessed Trinity". This is one of the mysteries of our Christian doctrine and teaching - along with the virgin birth, the Temptation of Jesus, the Transfiguration, the Atonement or sacrificial death of Jesus, the Resurrection, and the events of Pentecost, remembered last week.

I use the word mystery, because faith is something we believe in or which we often struggle with, and cannot prove scientifically. Faith or trust comes in when logic fails.

Some Christians struggle with one or the other of the above "mysteries". I am not qualified to explain the Holy Trinity, except to say the three persons of God are three aspects of the same person. A simple analogy is that H2O can be liquid, ice or steam, but it is still water.

We praise God because he is creator of all and sovereign of the universe (See Genesis 1)

We praise Jesus because he was the word made flesh, i.e. God taking on human form (See John's gospel chap. 1). We praise the Spirit because of the difference he/she makes in the lives of those who seek to be disciples. (Galatians 5:16 on)

Humans, too, are multi-faceted - made up of body, mind and spirit or soul, and we are meant to be holy or whole in our lives. I believe it is called holistic living.

We know often if our bodies are unfit, it affects how we feel mentally or in spirit. That is why sleep, good sensible food and exercise are important. If the mind is troubled that affects how we feel physically; If we are in a good relationship with God and others that affects how we feel mentally and spiritually, and encourages us to look after our bodies.

The fitter we are, the more active we can be. (Although of course, age and infirmity have to be made allowance for; and we sometimes only enjoy limited good health!)

So we offer ourselves – mind, body and spirit - to God, asking him to bless every part of our lives, to make us whole (or holy) in his eyes, who as Father created us and provides for us, who in Jesus died and redeemed us, and who as Holy Spirit guides, protects and comforts us. "God in three persons – blessed Trinity!" Every blessing, *John*.
