THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – PSALM 103 verses 1- 5 (part) NIV.

Praise the Lord, O my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name....and forget not all his benefits - who forgives all your sins ... crowns you with love and compassion, who satisfies your desires with good things......

REFLECTION - This part of a psalm by David, who is credited with over 70 of the 150 psalms, calls on us to praise or rejoice in God's goodness. It goes on to name three very important aspects of our relationship with our Lord. He forgives our sins, gives us love and compassion, and satisfies our wants with good things.

Taking these three aspects of God's care for his children in turn - a short look at forgiveness.

It is God's gracious gift to us that we are forgiven when we say sorry for our human frailties, and determine with spiritual help to live better lives. God doesn't just forget, according to scripture, he puts our sins behind us, as far as the east is from the west, and even though our sins be as scarlet they shall be white as snow. Forgiveness comes as a condition of our treatment of others, because we pray "forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us." How can we accept God's forgiveness yet refuse to forgive others?

God crowns us with love and compassion. Crowning involves anointing or elevating us to a special status, it is a symbolic way of saying that we are recognised by God as special in his sight, and in his gracious mercy he gives us his love and his caring; and "compassion" which is care in action. David would have used this phraseology recalling his own anointing by Samuel before he became king of Israel.

We have to remember always that our relationship with God enables us to trust him as provider, sustainer, the one who watches over us, our going out and our coming in and because he knows all about us,(ps. 139), he knows what is best for us and meets our wants (desires) in accord with his will for us, giving us "good things".

Let us acknowledge that all that we have and are comes about through God's love for us, so that with David we can truly say "Praise the Lord, O my soul." Every blessing, John.
