NEWS FROM THE BROMSGROVE & REDDITCH. CIRCUIT:

Vision Day 2 Follow Up Meeting held on 20th September. The consequences of the meeting's deliberations is that the 10 churches in the Circuit will remain primarily on their own, and will need to take responsibility themselves in seeking to address challenges and concerns that motivated Vision Day 2.

Two suggestions came from the meeting for follow on Circuit level groups:

- b) Compliance Group a group within the Circuit to call together, explore challenges and good practice and support local churches and individual officers in the churches with all manner of compliance issues (Finance, Property, GDPR, Copyright, Health and Safety etc).

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - Joshua 1 verse 9

"I hereby command you: be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you everywhere you go."

<u>REFLECTION</u> — In this verse from Joshua, the Israelites are about to invade the territory which is to become their new home, the land of Canaan, after forty long years of wandering in the desert wilderness after their escape from bondage in Egypt. Moses is dead, and Joshua, son of Nun, his assistant, has replaced him as leader of the fledgling nation, still comprising twelve tribes, named after Jacob's sons.

In this verse God is commanding the people to trust in his provision, his going before them, as they take possession of the land, and not to be frightened or dismayed. Because, he assures them through Joshua, the Lord their God is with them "everywhere they go".

We believe that God is eternal, unchanging, ever guiding, ever providing, ever present, and in his Son Jesus is the "same today, yesterday and forever".

Our lives are often looked upon as a journey, from birth, through infancy, child-hood, adolescence, maturity to adulthood, through our middle years, as perhaps parents and grandparents, to early old age, and eventual passing on. And God is with us every step of the way.

We have to make decisions as we get older: shall we downsize, shall we move to be nearer to our children and grandchildren, shall we decide to have that operation which will help our impaired mobility, shall we look for new opportunities of less demanding areas of service within the church or community?

Each of these decisions is important, but we can take them all to God in prayer, not being frightened or dismayed by them, but accepting that God will guide us: sometimes by direct prompting, maybe through the advice of professionals, at other times through discussion with family or friends, at other times through the experience of others, who have faced similar problems.

However as believers in God's all-pervading love, we know we need not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord God is indeed with us whatever we do or wherever we go.

Let us remember that we have a friend in Jesus, who has experienced all that we could face, and more, which is why we can confidently take everything to Him in prayer. However, we have to be strong and courageous, having made a decision to see it through with God's help. Every blessing, *John*.
