# THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – A favourite Carol. Silent Night (StF No.217)

The late Sinead O'Connor performs a beautiful version of this carol on U -Tube. It was written by a German composer Joseph Mohr who lived 1792 – 1848 and was translated into English by August Brooke (1832 – 1916).

If sung too slowly it can become a dirge, but the words bring a feeling of peace and serenity as the Virgin Mary looks after her new-born son.

The importance of the Nativity is the wonder of who the baby was to become. The angel song delivered the message "Christ the Redeemer is here!" in the second verse.

The time of Jesus' birth is referred to as the hour of grace, and the baby is referred to as the "Son of God, O how bright", referring to the light come into the world and the hearts of believers.

A scripture text associated with this carol is Luke 2 verses 8 to 12 - "In that region there were shepherds living in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid: for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people. To you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger'."

### CAROL: Silent night, holy night: sleeps the world. Hid from sight, Mary and Joseph in in stable bare, watch o'er the child beloved and fair, sleeping in heavenly rest.

### Silent night, holy night: shepherds first saw the light, Heard resounding clear and long, far and near, the angel-song: 'Christ the Redeemer is here !'

#### Silent night, holy night: Son of God, O how bright love is smiling from your face ! Strikes for us now the hour of grace, Jesus, Lord at your birth.
