THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Ephesians 5: 19b & 20. (NIV)

"Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

REFLECTION – This short passage is part of Paul the Apostle's teaching on Christian living

contained in his letter to the church at Ephesus which he helped to establish. It begins at chapter 4 verse 17 under the heading 'living as children of light'.

As we know singing is one of the most uplifting things; it cheers you up, encourages beneficial endorphins, helps you breath better, releases emotions, and when done with feeling works the face muscles; and when really enjoyed is often accompanied by swaying, clapping or even a little dance. To me singing, whether secular songs, or religious songs, Is always a joy. It surely comes under the heading 'make a joyful noise to the Lord!' If in public we can go about the day's activities merely singing in the heart, quietly or just humming, all of which helps one's mood. If it is a hymn song, then it helps recall God's goodness, mercy and love.

This leads on to the element of thankfulness and its importance in life. The phrase above speaks of 'always that of us being his children, for whom he has the best interests at heart, which includes his knowing what is best for us.

The word 'everything' may cause problems for some, because 'everything' can include things we would not have chosen, such as an accident, loss of a job, serious ill-health.

The ability to give thanks in those circumstances is where God's help enables us to find a positive in a difficult situation, and to submit to what cannot be changed.

The sentence ends 'in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ'. Jesus enjoyed happy times, e.g. the wedding in Cana, and miraculously turned water into wine to help the celebrations.

He also comforted Martha and Mary over the passing of Lazarus, so when we offer a prayer of thanks in his name, it is because he knows and understands, having been in common human situations himself.
