<u>THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Galatians 5 verses 22 & 23 (part)</u>...The fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control...

#### **REFLECTION:**

The nine fruits (or evidence of the Spirit's influence on our lives) are able to be divided into three threes: the first three towards God, the next three towards others, and the final three toward or for ourselves.

When we have put our trust in God, we receive immeasurable love, and our response is to **love** God as a heavenly parent in return. This newly discovered relationship can only give us **joy**, uplifting and contentment. **Peace** and a sense of calm, serenity even, enters our hearts because we know as we put our hand into God's to go forward in life, we are forgiven through Christ's sacrifice at Calvary, and given a new, transformed persona – empowered to live for God and others, instead of selfishly.

Patience, kindness and generosity are then evident in our dealings with others. Whereas previously we would be brisk, uninterested, critical, even prejudiced at times, the Holy spirit working within and through us enables us to treat people, whether neighbours, family, friends, colleagues and the stranger with respect, courtesy and consideration. Indeed to do to others as we would have them do to us, to quote Jesus.

As we continue to experience God's guidance, strength and presence with us on a daily basis, so we see our **faithfulness** deepen, and become more comprehending of God's purpose for us. We seek to replace those traits which are less attractive, and develop a **gentleness** of character, a large part of which is **self-control** – of our tempers, our words, our hasty actions.

So we seek daily, to produce the fruit of the believer, in which we aim to please our Saviour God, to show love to others, as we have been first loved, and to look after our own spiritual growth, all to God's glory.
