THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – WHY EASTER EGGS ?

<u>COMMENT</u>: When we buy or consume or give Easter eggs, or take part in Easter egg hunts with the children or grandchildren, do we consider why the tradition is there? The Easter bunny by the way has no connection, and is purely a commercial ploy: at a stretch it could be said that rabbits are a-plenty about springtime. Eggs symbolise new life. They were a pre-Christian symbol of fertility and regeneration of Nature and the earth in Europe as spring followed the dormant period of winter.

European Christians borrowed this image and applied it not to the regeneration of the earth, but to specifically the new resurrection life of Jesus when he rose on the third day on what we know as Easter Day. New life emerges from eggshells, just as Jesus rose from his tomb. The Easter egg also symbolises the new life that faith in Christ offers believers.

Come to think of it, all life comes from an egg or a seed – both human and plantlife.

The tradition of decorating eggs is an ancient one. Early Christians decorated theirs red to symbolise Christ's shed blood at Calvary.

Our word Easter is believed to derive from the old English word "Eastre", the name of a pre-Christian goddess, associated with Spring and fertility.

However we view the symbolism of eggs, whether to do with regeneration of the earth or regeneration of the Christian soul, we see the loving hand of God at work.

This understanding should take away the feeling of guilty pleasure as we (perhaps) indulge in a chocolate egg or two. Every blessing *John*.
