#### The Case for the Refurbishment of the Church Toilets:

Our premises were built just over 40 years ago, and we now urgently need to replace the toilet facilities in the main building, they simply are not fit for purpose. There is not an accessible toilet, and the recommendation is for individual gender-neutral cubicles.

The community of Bromsgrove widely uses the centre. The daily Welcome Café serves drinks and snacks at very reasonable prices and a monthly Ukraine Café serves home-made Ukrainian food. There is also a monthly Memory Changes Café for those living with Dementia and their care partners.

The toddler group is thriving serving some 30 toddlers weekly, and there is a waiting list. The Boys' Brigade provides a variety of activities weekly for around 55 boys aged between 4-18, with 3 male and 4 female leaders. The Girls' Brigade provides activities weekly for around 25 girls aged between 4-14 with 4 female Leaders.

Other community activities include, Line Dancing, Keep Fit classes, a choir, singing groups, sewing, and knitting groups. Social groups include a meeting place for those bereaved, providing sign posting, social activities and outings. There is also a place to meet providing games and quizzes.

The U3A, The Bromsgrove Society and Rhythm Time are also regular users of the premises. Gamblers Anonymous and Alcoholics Anonymous meet weekly. The Community Police also hold regular meetings in the Welcome Café.

The building is also a church and there is all inclusive worship every Sunday and the opportunity to join study / discussion groups during the week.

We are in the process of seeking plans and quotations and hope to future proof the toilets for a further forty years! There will be a fully accessible toilet, baby changing facility, a small toilet for toddlers, and gender-neutral individual cubicles complete with hand washing facilities. We estimate that this project will cost in the region of £70k. *The Management Committee*

# James: You do not even know what will happen tomorrow....You ought to say, 'If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this and that (James 4:14, 15)

### COMMENT:

It is easy to drift through life, taking so many daily blessings for granted, such as health, friendships, financial stability. Instead we should trust that everything we need God, provides us (see earlier in Matthew 6): giving us clothing food and shelter, so that we can be freed up to serve according to the gifts we have been given – referred to by Jesus as seeking the kingdom of heaven.

We should try to awake each day, thank God for it. It is a matter of making plans for each day and seeking God's will for those plans. It is, perhaps, a good practice to plot out in one 's minds the day ahead, and then at the end of it to review it, and to thank God, for what has happened in it.

Even if the unexpected has happened and some disaster has occurred, we can try to see God's hand in it. It is a truism that tomorrow never comes. It is always today.

Regarding tomorrow, however, we have to sensibly make certain plans, so that several weeks or months later, we are prepared for certain things to happen. Examples are - planning a holiday, it has to be booked many months ahead, and arrangements made to pay for it; prepping for exams; or making provision for retirement funding.

So with James, we take no tomorrow for granted, but do our bit, and trust that if it is God's will, our plans will materialise.

We live in the present and hope and trust for the future. Every blessing, John.
