THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - Hymn StF No. 495 - Part

Drop thy still dews of quietness, till all our strivings cease; take from our souls the strain and stress, and let our ordered lives confess the beauty of thy peace.

Breathe through the heats of our desire thy coolness and thy balm; Let sense be dumb, let flesh retire; speak through the earthquake, wind and fire, O still small voice of calm!

<u>BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE</u> – John Greenleaf Whittier (1807-1892) was an American anti-slavery campaigner, politician, poet and lifelong Quaker. He ran successfully for congress in 1832 and campaigned for the Republican party. The whole of this hymn (Dear Lord and father of mankind) was adapted from a longer poem by

Whittier entitled "Brewing of Soma" by Garrett Horder in 1884, for inclusion in his Congregational Hymns. It is usually sung to Parry's "Repton". The final stanza beginning "let sense be dumb" builds to a crescendo on "the earthquake, wind and fire", fading to a much more softly "O still small voice of calm".

These two verses are a beautiful hymn-prayer, I think, which follow the plea in the first verse for the Lord to "forgive our foolish ways". One of the blessings of worship is that in it we find quietness, and in these days of busy, active, involved lives, I think we all need to find "dews of quietness", to learn to stop striving and struggling, and just let God take from us the "strain and stress", to find the "peace" which Jesus gives us through our relationship with him. He says "My peace I leave with you, not as the world gives". Learning to be quiet and to find the "beauty of peace" with God, who is Father, Son and Holy spirit, does enable us to "order our lives" in a less frenetic way.

Whittier continues with the thought that we can allow God to, in a sense, infiltrate our beings with "coolness" of spirit, a kind of "balm" to our troubled hearts and minds. Reference is made to Elijah and his hiding in a cave, when he was persecuted by King and Ahab and Queen Jezebel, after he had had the false prophets of Baal slain, and he was desperately fleeing for his life. God comes to him and speaks to him, not in the earthquake, wind, or fire which are at first manifested, but in a "still small voice" of calm. (For the story see 1 Kings chaps 18 and 19).

We all need to learn how to "let sense be dumb, and let flesh retire", and to hear God speak to us, to let his quietness and peace fall upon us, to let go, and to receive his indescribable peace. Every blessing. *John*.
