THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Matthew 6 verse 34

"Therefore do not worry about tomorrow. For tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own".

REFLECTION.

These words of Jesus, are part of the Sermon on the Mount spread across chapters, 5, 6 and 7, when Jesus taught his disciples at the beginning of his public ministry.

He had in the preceding verses been saying that God knows what we need and values the birds of the air and the lilies of the field enough to not only create them but to care for them, and that people are far more valuable than them (v.26) and

that his hearers should trust God to give food, drink and clothing. He also says to seek or look for God's kingdom and a right way of life (righteousness) as a motivation and the essentials will then be given.

Forgive me for being uncharacteristically political perhaps here. However, in our modern British society (as well as overseas), people are facing unprecedented hardship. If people do not have the essentials, food, clothing, shelter, there is little point in telling them God loves them. This has become known as the social gospel - feed people's bodies first, then worry about their souls. That basically was the calling William Booth followed some 150 years ago when he founded the Salvation Army, who are still working for the good of all who seek their help.

Speaking personally, we are called today, I think, perhaps more than ever, to give to the needy, to support those less fortunate than ourselves, when we hear on the news, so frequently about the increasing rise of food banks, the need for free school meals, and the shocking fact of 3.9 million children living in poverty in our "prosperous" nation..

So for families in that situation, each day <u>does</u> have enough trouble of its own; they live from day to day, and the words of the Lord's prayer "give us this day our daily bread" are relevant still.

Our government agencies (local and national) are deemed responsible for looking after the citizens, whose votes put them in power, but as ever, it is the private individuals, volunteer agencies and members of the public, whose giving supports relevant charities, whose work often makes the real difference.

May we then, in whatever small way we can, as individuals and as a church, do what we can to alleviate this situation, so that tomorrow for so many people In our troubled society, may be <u>better</u> than today. For, after all, God's love Is in our hands to give, because <u>we</u> are meant to be his lips, his hands and his feet, and to share that love in a practical way. Every blessing, *John*.
