THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – PSALM 84 (part). See No. 814 in Singing the Faith.

How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts!

My soul longs, indeed, it faints for the courts of the Lord;

Happy are those who live in your house, ever singing your praise......

For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere.

I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than live in

the tents of wickedness......

The Lord bestows favour and honour.

No good thing does the Lord God withhold from those who walk uprightly.

O Lord of hosts, happy is everyone who trusts in you.

REFLECTION:

During the time of lockdown, due to Covid, we all missed the opportunity to gather together in church (God's dwelling place, also referred to as the house of God).

In passing, we are grateful to those who faithfully took care of the building, supervising the water supply was uncontaminated due to lack of use, ensuring essential cleaning was done, heating it to a minimum in the winter months and so on, so that all was well when we could once again meet.

What does our church mean to us, I wonder?

We are looking at a serious situation where the finances may not enable us to continue to use the whole building in the future. So, we all have a vested interest in finding a solution to our monetary problems.

To me it is a house of prayer, praise and service for God and others. It is a place where I am able to sing God's goodness and love; to offer petitions on behalf of others; to say "sorry" to God, for my weakness and failings; to hear God's word expounded for my comfort, but to also, at times jolt me out of complacency.

Further it is a place where joy and sorrows are shared, where we can listen to each other's stories of God's grace and mercy in our individual lives.

In addition to that, the building was built and opened nearly 40 years ago to be a place where the community of Bromsgrove can be served; where people can find a welcome, find friendship, even find their Saviour, and get to know Jesus as their life companion.

We have many groups who weekly use our building, some as hirers of rooms, others as part of the wider church family - mums and little ones, Brigade boys, exercise classes, knit and natter groups, a youth group from one of the neighbouring churches, friendship groups including CAMEO and Meeting Point. Then there are others such as ancestry groups, and local history association. The list of what goes on is amazing, and it is possible that we see a footfall including Sunday worship of close to five hundred people a week.

As the psalmist says, above, we don't seek a position of importance or status in the fellowship – it is enough just to be a "doorkeeper" - as long as we still have access to our building which has seen us so blessed over the past 40 years!

We have the option of often going somewhere, instead of to church, on Sunday; but as the psalm says,, a day in the "courts" of God is "better than a thousand elsewhere."

So, let us remember to seek God's guidance and blessing in these difficult times in our church life, because those who stay close to God find that "he bestows favour and honour" and in the end "happy is everyone who trusts in him."

So, I repeat the question, put another way- How important is our church to each of us?

What can we each one do to ensure it stays open to serve the community, not just for now, but for future generations. That is the challenge for now and the coming months. Every blessing, *John*.
